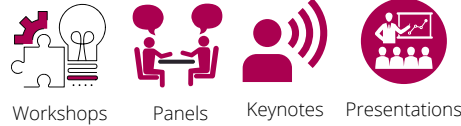

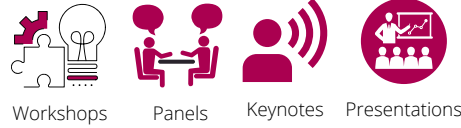

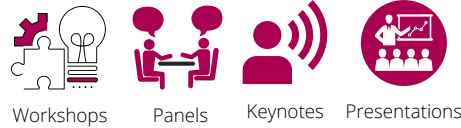

One of the benefits of attending professional events is to grow your network and make lasting connections. Our events platform allows simple connections and conversations to take place at any point – including before and after the event ends.

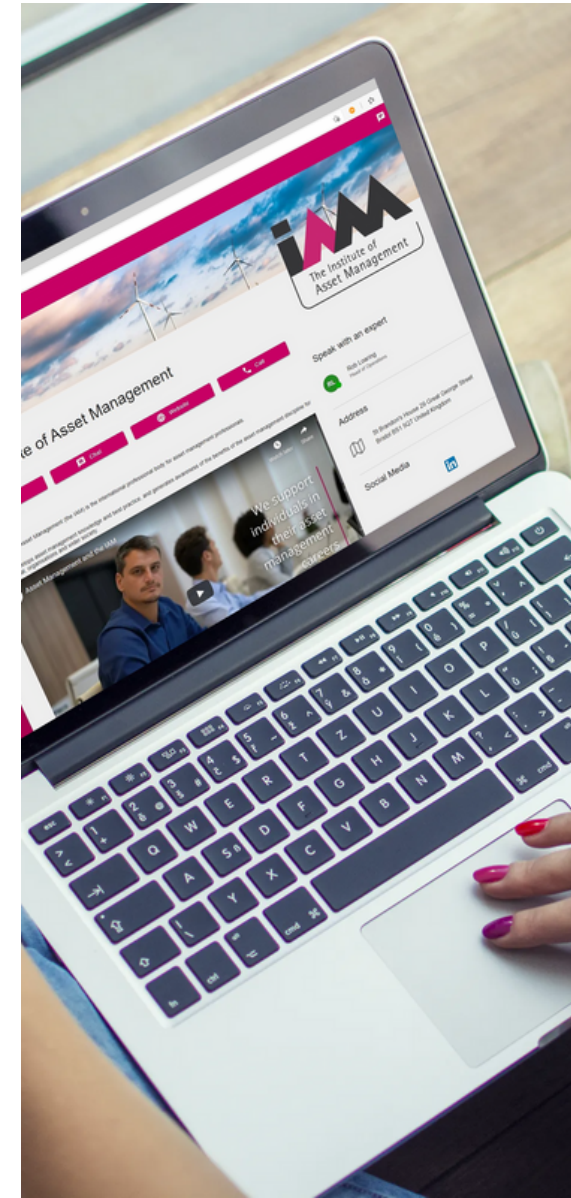
